

### **Been Sinned Against?**

We all as Christians know the familiar verse from Scripture, "Where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them." Matthew 18.20 Often this is spoken when gathering for meetings or prayer services within our parish communities. Did

you know that this teaching from Jesus was about how to reconcile with someone who has sinned against you?

Often, recalling how another person sinned against you prompts unpleasant memories even if you have been able to reconcile. The memories might stem from the fact that you were caught off guard by a sinful act against you personally. Jesus is fully aware of the human condition of his people offending one another and he offers instruction in resolving such offenses.

> First – go to the person who has offended you to discuss the matter.

Second – If the offender refuses to listen, take two or three as your witness and try again. Third – If that too, fails, take it to the church, meaning the community.

Finally – If that does not move the person to reconciliation, "treat them as you would a Gentile or a tax collector." Matthew 18.17

It seems Jesus might be telling us that some cases are just a lost cause. But not so. Jesus open our minds to the possibility that not all people know him and what he teaches, for instance, the Gentiles or the tax collectors who have yet to change their ways. But those are exactly the people Jesus came into this world to save: the sinners. If we have come to understand the ways and teaching of Jesus, it becomes our responsibility to pray for and do all we can to welcome those who have not had the opportunity to know him. In this way, Jesus is inviting us, calling us as his disciples to evangelization, welcoming new members into our communities.

So, the next time we hear "Where two or three are gathered in my name, I am in their midst", let us remember our call to always welcome others and in the process, come to understand that there may be times we are "sinned against", but even that experience can open the door to us and those we invite to draw closer to Jesus Christ.

### HOLY LAND COLLECTION SEPT 12/13

For many years on Good Friday, a collection is gathered in Catholic churches around the world to support the work of the Franciscans serving in the Holy Land, preserving the holy places where the saving work of Christ took place in history and continuing to proclaim the Gospel in word and deed.

Due to COVID-19, that collection for 2020 has been rescheduled to the weekend of September 12-13. These dates are chosen as close to the Feast of the Triumph of the Holy Cross on September 14.

The pandemic, its impact on tourism, the persecution of Christians in that area, and the simple ongoing needs of parishes and programs among the poor there make your generosity in solidarity with our sisters and brothers in the Holy Land especially welcome. As we are still not able to take up collections in the usual manner, each parish will have a separate basket at the entrances the weekend Masses on September 12-13 for you to make a contribution. You may use an envelope marked "Holy Land" or simply drop in your cash or check. You may also mail your gift to your parish if you prefer. Thank you for your generous support to the work of the Gospel in the Holy Land.

It was one of the diocese's first attempts at presenting on a virtual format and we are grateful for participants' goodwill as we learn new ways to stay connected. ### Faith Formation 2020-2021

We are currently awaiting the arrival of guidelines from the Diocese of St. Cloud for Faith Formation in parishes during the pandemic. We hope to have a plan in place soon for grades 1-10. Registration materials will be sent to you as soon as the plan is set. Thank you for your patience!

Much of our fall festival event will not take place this year. We are unable to gather, socialize and enjoy our outdoor festivities given the current pandemic. However, the Parish Festival generates significant income for the parish budget, so we still plan to have the



big ticket raffle, a quilt raffle, an online auction, and a virtual Franny Flyer run this year on the weekend of September 19-20.

Last year FrantoberFest generated net income of \$63K, with the raffle accounting for nearly half of that. There are great prizes to win — a cash grand prize of \$3,000 as well as gift certificates, products and additional cash prizes. Chances are \$5 each and will be distributed in the Gathering Place starting August 22.

You will also be able to buy quilt raffle tickets for the chance to buy a beautiful handmade quilt. We will keep you posted on plans for the raffle drawing on Sunday, September 20, 2020 at noon.

Without all of the other events of our traditional festival, we will have a financial shortfall. Therefore, we ask all households to prayerfully consider making a \$100 donation to the parish festival this year. This will help with the parish budget that relies on the income from the Parish Festival. Any additional donation you can make beyond buying raffle tickets would be greatly appreciated and help our budget stay healthy.

### **ADORATION**
