

It can be repeated as often as beneficial during the course of an illness. The effect of this sacrament is unite our human sufferings with those of Christ and His Cross, to forgive sin, and to receive healing in spirit and, if necessary for the good of the person, also in body.

St. Francis Xavier parish has provided an evening meal the first Wednesday of the month for the homeless at Place of Hope in St. Cloud for more than 10 years. We have a great group of leaders for that ministry in Marcie Popowski, Mary Kuhlmann, Barb Kroll, and Pat Feneis. In addition, many members of SFX have contributed time, food, and funds to feed the poor among us.

COVID 19 has altered the way we provide this ministry as we are not at this time able to be in their kitchen preparing or serving a meal. We do however plan to continue to provide the groceries to feed upward of 170 people who are served each evening. With the cooler weather approaching, that number is sure to increase. It is estimated to cost about \$300.00 to provide one meal and at this time we do have remaining funds contributed by the people of our parish. We will put those to good use in the coming months and be in touch with the whole of the parish if more funds are needed. This early text shows that the Church understood very soon after the Resurrection that the healing power of the Cross is at work through the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. 
