MINISTRY & LIFE PERSPECTIVES

Today we continue to read from Mark's Gospel, learning more about the ministry of Jesus. Jesus cured Simon's mother-in-law, and she immediately began to serve Jesus and his disciples. Jesus also cured many others who were brought to him, healing their illnesses and driving out demons. As we will see throughout Mark's Gospel, Jesus



did not permit the demons to speak because they knew his identity and would have revealed it to those who were present.

On the morning after this busy day, Jesus retreated in prayer, but was pursued by Simon and others who brought news that many people were looking for him. At this point in Mark's Gospel, we begin to see a distinct role for the inner circle of Jesus' disciples. They act as intermediaries between Jesus and the people. Jesus reports to his disciples that they need to leave Capernaum to preach in other places.

Today's Gospel completes a picture of Jesus' ministry: preaching, curing the sick, driving out demons, and then moving on to continue this work in another place. Mark's Gospel tells us that Jesus did this throughout Galilee.

Jesus' compassion and healing of the sick is a sign of the Kingdom of God. The Church continues to extend Christ's healing presence to others in its ministry to the sick. In the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, the Church prays for spiritual and physical healing, forgiveness of sins, and comfort for those who are suffering from illness.

In today's Gospel we also notice the importance of prayer in Jesus' daily life. Jesus rose early in the morning, removed himself from the crowds, and went to a deserted place to pray. When the disciples found him, he told them that it was time to move on. We believe that in his prayers Jesus found guidance and direction from God. We also bring our decision-making to God in prayer, asking for his guidance and direction in our lives.

As we see, even Jesus prays. In this act of love and devotion to God, we are all called to recognize the importance of prayer. Prayer is an important part of Catholic worship as it provides the opportunity to communicate with God. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states, "Prayer is the raising of one's heart and mind to God or the requesting of good things from God" (CCC no. 2259). This shows that prayer is considered a two-way process. Catholics pray to God to develop spiritually, and God has the power to answer prayers.

An Adapted Ash Wednesday - Sprinkled Ashes

On January 12, Cardinal Sarah of Rome's Congregation for Divine Worship issued a "Note" with instructions for the "Distribution of Ashes in Time of Pandemic." Bishop Kettler has directed that our parishes comply with this adaptation for receiving ashes this year on Ash Wednesday, February 17.

The ashes will be blessed, and the formula "Repent and believe in the Gospel" (or, "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return") is said only once over the entire congregation. Then the faithful process to the stations where ashes are distributed, and a small amount is <u>lightly sprinkled</u> on each person's head in silence, rather than applying them directly to the forehead.

Have you ever experienced a time in your life when you were overwhelmed by the tasks that were your responsibility? You may know that you need to continue to give them your

attention, but to do so, you need to

take a "time out", you need to be alone for a bit, just to put all in perspective. God, please be with me.



It seems that Jesus, in the fullness of his humanity experienced that need, for in today's Gospel from St. Mark we hear of the busyness of his ministry, the intense response by the people of the need to be healed, both physically and spiritually. And again, Jesus modeled for us the very real need to step away to take time to pray. If Jesus needs time to pray to his Father, how much more do we need the same?

To be sure this past year has impacted our lives in a way that we have never known; the pandemic, the changes in how we work or attend school, the limited way in which we gather at Church, the political climate and the racial and social divide that seems to be on the increase. All of this might be overwhelming us, just as Jesus may have been overwhelmed by the complexity of public ministry. We need to pray more today than perhaps any other time in our lives!

It is important to nurture your spiritual life with prayer, being in the presence of God. God is always there for us; however, we fail to take ample opportunity to be with Him. Yet, by faith, we know that our strength to continue our journey in this life is found in God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Jesus, who proclaimed he is the Way, the Truth, and the Life, leads the way to our finding true peace and happiness. We, of course, need to continue all that we are responsible for in our lives, but we may have to adjust the amount of time we spend in prayer that we might draw strength and wisdom to continue our tasks with the grace made known to us in time alone with God.

Let us all be more committed to daily, and at times, hourly prayer. Let us remember that God is to be the very center of our lives. So that, just as Jesus turned to his Father, we turn to ours, the Father who unites us all as a people of God. We can only imagine that God is waiting to hear from us as his knowledge of our lives and the depth of his love are immeasurable. And let us with grateful hearts, praise him and thank him for his constant presence. God be with us we pray.




