MINISTRY & LIFE PERSPECTIVES



From Safari......

A tease of warmth reminds us that spring has come, at least meteorologically speaking. March is a month of madness and of passion. Madness includes the fever of sport from the colleges to the high schools and here in Minnesota the famed tournament snowstorms. We end this month

with Palm Sunday, and we will actively enter into the passion of our savior Jesus Christ.

We continue our Lenten Journey with an account of the cleaning of the temple. Everyone gets angry, even Jesus got angry. Anger is bound to happen as we interact with one another. Today Jesus models for us righteous anger in the Gospel, not all anger is sinful. His anger stirs as he sees the temple a place of prayer and communion with God being turned into a marketplace. Jesus approaches the vendors and moneychangers and chases them out of the temple.

Justified anger stirs in those who see human life being disrespected whether in the womb or in the streets. This anger generates such responses as those causes that seek to end abortion, discrimination, poverty, or hunger.

How to avoid sinful anger. Give yourself a timeout - count to ten, go for jog or walk, listen to your favorite music. If you feel like shouting or calling someone names, do it where no one else can hear. Most importantly, work at resolving the issue you have with another. This is hard work and requires prayer.

Last week at the St. Francis Xavier School Mass, in addressing anger, I shared this anonymous Angry Prayer. (includes actions)

God we do get angry.

Plant your feet firmly on the floor.

Sometimes we get so angry that our fists ball up. Make fists.

We get so angry that we want to stomp our feet. Stomp your feet.

We get so angry our arms and face and whole body shakes.

Shake all over.

We just want to scream.

Scream!

PAUSE

O Lord,

Be with us when we get that angry.

Reach out your clinched fists, palms up

Gently uncurl our fists, loosen our arms, and relax our faces.

Slowly uncurl your fists and shake your arms loose.

Help us think of ways to fix what is wrong.

Thoughtfully scratch your head.

Be with us as we try to make things better.

Open hands out palms up and look up

We pray in Jesus name. Amen.

Fold your hands in prayer

Continued blessings on your Lenten Journey.



Prove It!

In our Second Reading for this Sunday St. Paul writes to the people of Corinth and speaks of how the Jewish people were always demanding signs to show proof that something

was of God while the Greeks preferred words of wisdom to enlighten them.

Then in the Gospel, there it is, the Jews demanding a sign from Jesus who in anger had expelled the people who were making a marketplace out of his Father's house. "What sign can you show us for doing this?" They were demanding Jesus to show proof that this temple was HIS Father's house. They were demanding proof that Jesus was the Son of God. But the explanation that Jesus gave them made no sense to them:

"Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up."
John 2.19

It made no sense because they were thinking only about the temple in which they were standing, and Jesus was speaking of the temple of his body that would rise three days after it was hung on the cross. The Gospel ends with this verse:

". . . and he did not need anyone to testify about human nature. He himself understood it well."

John 2.25

Jesus knew these people well, just as he knows us. He did not share all of who he was for he knew it would be necessary for the people to see it for themselves. Being told something by someone is one thing but witnessing it is something altogether different.

We were not present at the time of Christ, yet we understand who Jesus is through faith. A faith that has been handed down for generations dating back to those who walked with Jesus. Do we, like the Jews, still demand signs of proof of who Jesus is? Do you know and believe in your heart that he is the Son of God, that he was born of Mary and became man? Do you believe he died on the cross, that his body was destroyed and that he in fact, rose from the dead, just as he had stated to the people listening to him in the temple that day?

Our believing in Jesus Christ and who he is as the Son of God, born of the Holy Spirit is our gift of faith. "We walk by faith and not by sight" 2 Cor 5.7, and by that gift of faith we experience a loving and forgiving God who is with us always. How can we repay that? Jesus tells us with three words: love one another. For by loving others, we love God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. What acts of love will you shower on others this week? Take time to thank God for the gift of Jesus and our shared faith in him and go about your days loving one another. Then come to the Gathering Place, to place your acts of love on the Cross as an offering to Jesus.


