MINISTRY & LIFE PERSPECTIVES



Hello All,

Being new to the community, I would like to take this time to introduce myself a little more. I grew up in Long Prairie as the 2nd of 9 kids (5 boys and 4 girls). I have two siblings that are married, two living the young adult single life, a couple are

in college and two in high school. Growing up, life was fun and crazy. At the parish in Long Prairie we had Fr. Mark Stang as our pastor. His witness opened my eyes up to the goodness of the priesthood and of the Catholic faith. In high school I put a lot of effort into sports, particularly cross country, basketball and track.

My freshman year I went to NDSU. GO BISON! That same year, during the fall, I had a powerful encounter in the confessional. I just knew that I was going to be a priest, and the strange thing was that I had no fear, at least in that moment. I knew it was something outside of me, from God, that I had to respond to. The following year I found myself at the seminary down at St. Thomas (GO TOMMIES!!).

Even though I had that powerful experience in the confessional, I still had a lot of fears of loneliness, public speaking, and just being a counter-cultural figure in general. Gradually (as God seems to work) these fears lessened and a steady desire in me grew to give myself to God in celibacy and to serve Him and His people as a priest.

I have been ordained four years. The first two years I was at St. Mary's Cathedral and St. Augustine. The past two years and currently, I am a chaplain at Cathedral High School and assistant vocations director for the St. Cloud Diocese.

I am very grateful to be a priest. When I am aware of God, and the gift of life, it seems like I am in heaven. So many things I could never have anticipated. They are simply God's way of reaching out to me.

I love fishing and hunting! Oddly enough, when people ask me what I like most about fishing and hunting, I tell them that it is coming home after the outing. Cleaning fish with my parents and siblings and sharing a meal together after the time away is one of the things that I am most grateful for.

Prayers for each of you, please keep me in your prayers as well.



LIVESTREAMING MASSES

Livestreaming Masses - The Next Phase

On behalf of so many – parishioners and participants from a variety of states, in fact – I offer a most hearty Thank You to the Sacred Heart staff who rose so generously and competently to the occasion to make livestreamed Masses available since March when COVID restrictions did not permit in-person Mass attendance. In the intervening months, they have continually labored to improve the experience and support one another. You can be truly and justly inspired by their service to the Gospel in this unexpected outreach.

As school begins soon, we have discussed how to accommodate even more demands on time and energy among the staff with getting kids off to school – and hopefully not having to help their children with distance learning again! – and attend to the adapted ordinary ministries of the parishes. At the same time, we hear clearly how much people value the livestreamed Mass opportunities. We also know that many of our volunteers are understandably not yet ready to resume their roles out of legitimate concern for their health and the health of family members.

Thus, for weekdays, we have decided to continue to offer a livestreamed Mass each Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday, although with some simplified presentation to allow only one staff person to run the technology. The screens will not be used, so the Responsorial Psalm and Mass parts will be done from memory or from your own missal or worship resources. The camera will simply be a steady wide focus, and the audio will be the ambient sound of the church space. Please be patient as we learn how to do this most effectively.

For weekends, we will continue to livestream the 5pm Saturday evening Mass from Sacred Heart, and St. Francis Xavier will livestream their 9:30am Sunday Mass. As the celebrants and deacons will continue to rotate through our ACC parishes, we believe this will continue to offer choices for you while relieving some of the time commitment by staff. Sacred Heart's Mass will be available to view on Sunday or later as well if you prefer.

I remind you that the obligation to attend Mass remains suspended. We do ask your cooperation with Bishop Kettler's directive that all observe social distancing and wear masks while in the building (unless a medical condition does not allow this for an individual). This is an act of charity out of concern for the common good, a simple but effective work of mercy that each of us can offer.

Finally, you will no longer see the yellow cards to mark where you are seated for cleaning purposes on the weekends. This is because we will simply sanitize the entire seating area after the weekend Masses; our numbers make that a more reasonable approach for our cleaners. Thank you!

PRAYER CHANGES THINGS:

It is my goal that EVERY student in grades 6-12 is prayed for, by name, everyday for this year. I look forward to telling each of our students that they are being prayed for by name by someone in our parish. What better way to support the youth in our parish as they continue to grow in their faith and also as they start to ask questions about their faith. Each of the envelopes in the authering area will contain the names and a little information about three students in our parish. One of the greatest hesitations people experience when thinking about becoming a prayer partner is, "I don't know what to pray for or how to pray." Enclosed in your envelope will be six months worth of calendars. Each day there will be a short specific prayer to say, if you choose to use it. We ask that you fill out the bottom of the letter, to register as a prayer partner. Then we can mail you your second set of prayer calendars in February, but more importantly, we can hold you in prayer also.

Please prayerfully consider taking an envelope after mass, to become a prayer partner for the youth of our parish. If you would prefer an envelope be mailed to you, you can contact Melissa Fox (320-761-2217) or call the main office, and we will get one in the mail to you!

AFTERSHOCK MISSION MINISTRY: We are implementing a new aspect to Aftershock this year called Mission Ministry. We will provide students who sign up with specific supplies to complete that month's Mission. Supplies can be picked up at Church, during aftershock or even dropped at your door step. We are excited about this and will share our first Mission Ministry activity in August with our young people.

Much of our fall festival event will not take place this year. We are unable to gather, socialize and enjoy our outdoor festivities given the current pandemic. However, the Parish Festival generates significant income for the parish budget, so we still plan to have the

Without all of the other events of our traditional festival, we will have a financial shortfall. Therefore, we ask all households to prayerfully consider making a \$100 donation to the parish festival this year. This will help with the parish budget that relies on the income from the Parish Festival. Any additional donation you can make beyond buying raffle tickets would be greatly appreciated and help our budget stay healthy.
