MINISTRY & LIFE PERSPECTIVES



The wonderful artistic hand of God has been quite visible in recent weeks. The hoar frost has given us wonderfully flocked trees, branches delicately outlined in frost, and amazing designs clinging to screens and windows. I could not help but be in wonder for what God has done. St.

Thomas Aquinas said that wonder was the first step on the ladder that leads to God.

Perhaps our barren winter landscape gives us pause to reflect on God's hand at work in our lives? The anniversary of the 1973 Roe vs Wade decision invites us to reflect on the wonder of human life. Within weeks of conception, the child's head and neck are becoming visible and with each passing day, the body in all its wonder is taking shape. There is no doubt that sacred human life is developing in the womb. O Lord, help all to see and cherish the child in the womb, as our brother and sister through Jesus Christ.

This past Monday, the nation remembered the birthday of Martin Luther King Jr. Martin led a civil rights movement which challenged people to see God's hand at work in every human person, regardless of skin color, political persuasion, or ethnic background. In the words of MLK, "Lightning makes no sound until it strikes." "We may have all come on different ships, but we're in the same boat now." "The quality, not the longevity, of one's life is what is important." "Love is the only force capable of transforming an enemy into a friend." O Lord, give us the love to see all as our sister and brother.

We are in the midst of the week of Prayer for Christian Unity. Theological differences have brought about the division in the Church of Christ. Instead of being at wonder for the salvation, we find ways to limit God's ways. "Abide in my love... you shall bear much fruit." (John 15:1-17) is the theme for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity (January 18-25). Begun in 1908, these days have been set aside each year so that Christians the world over may share the prayer of Jesus: "that all may be one... that the world may believe" (John 17:21). O Lord, help us make your Son's prayer a reality.

What nourishes your wonder? Stars or snowflakes or the human hand or a bright red cardinal or the gnarled hands of the elderly? O Lord, we thank you for the gift of wonder.

Lenten Bible Study Opportunity

Are you interested in participating in a small group Bible study for the Lenten season? Consider signing up for "Wisdom – God's Vision For Life".

Here is an overview: Scripture and the Tradition of the Catholic Church provide an abundance of wisdom, though it can often be challenging to apply it to our lives. In this eight-part study, Jeff Cavins and Thomas Smith examine biblical wisdom as it relates to daily life. Drawing on the wisdom literature of the Bible - Proverbs, Wisdom, Sirach, and Ecclesiastes - Wisdom: God's Vision for Life will teach you how to actively seek sound guidance and increase your sense of peace in navigating life.

In everything from friendships to finances, from making decisions to attaining peace of mind, Scripture offers a vision for happiness and well-being. With this program, you will learn how to gather, gain, and grow in wisdom, and you will experience the joy it brings to your life. The 8-week course will be conducted via Zoom beginning Tuesday, Feb. 16, 6:30 p.m. Sessions last about 1 hour with a 30-minute on-line video and discussion. There will be two sessions (Tuesday & Thursday), the weeks of March 15 and March 22 to finish before the start of Holy Week.

Participants will need computer access with audio & video, and the sessions will be closed to anyone other than participating members to assure privacy. Cost per participant is \$19.95 which includes a journal, on-line video access, and an on-line workbook. Payment should be made to St. Francis Xavier Parish.

Updates for One in Christ ACC virtual meeting via Zoom held on January 5th, 2021

Committees:

- Each committee should include at least one member from each parish but that person does not need to be a member of the Planning Council. Each committee will include at least one member of the ACC Planning Council to ensure sufficient communication. We are looking to involve more parish members in the work of the committees for their creative ideas and to foster communication with parishioners. Contact your parish representatives if you are interested.
- Stewardship Committee is working on education by sharing the book "Stewardship Success" with parish leaders on the Finance and Pastoral Councils and staff.
- Evangelization Committee is firming up plans to send
 a letter from the Planning Council to each parish
 household and to make follow up calls by fellow
 parishioners as a form of encouragement, connection,
 and support, as well as receive any questions about
 the ACC.
- Young Adult Committee shared a proposal to hire a
 young adult coordinator to serve all four parishes. This
 proposal will be refined and discussed by the Councils
 in each parish. No decision has been made. The
 committee is working on establishing an advisory
 board and will continue to offer opportunities for
 young adults to include all four parishes.
- Worship Committee is seeking new members to assist with future formation & training for ushers, lectors, servers, etc. along with other liturgy planning.

There was discussion about restructuring the ACC Planning Council to create better connection and collaboration with the ongoing Pastoral Councils in each parish around achieving the shared goals of our ACC while providing for individual parish identity and its own programs and traditions. This will be on the agenda for the next meeting

The next meeting will take place virtually via Zoom on February 2nd, 2021.

AUDIO VISUAL

"Thank you for sharing her celebration of life. Over 17 of us all over the United States were able to watch and feel like we were in the front pew."

When COVID hit last spring, we jumped into livestreaming with a phone, prayers on paper and the sound of children whispering next to the person in charge of the phone (yes, this is me and my kids). We quickly pivoted and within a week were livestreaming with a camcorder that still holds a place of honor in pew number 3, ambo side. We've tweaked things a little, added a second camcorder for the sign language interpreter, switched in a computer better able to handle the video required to livestream and now we have a reasonable system in place. And we get comments like the one above regularly. People are very grateful for the opportunity to be a part of a funeral for a loved one or worship regularly with us when they are unable to be here in person due to health concerns.

Behind the scenes, the "reasonable" system is a kind of complicated-to-operate, patched together system. We have four, 17-year old, non-digital cameras, extra pew space taken up for the in-church camera and a makeshift studio for the interpreter in the reconciliation room. We are so grateful to have what we do, no question about that, but we want to do better and put a more permanent system in place that will allow us to continue to livestream indefinitely. Even when COVID ceases to be the threat it is today, the opportunity to evangelize by offering people the ability to take part in funerals, weddings, praise and worship nights, special speakers, or a livestreamed Mass on the weekends, this is an opportunity that helps us bring our Mission and Vision statements to life. An additional benefit is that this system will give us the capability of security monitoring and recording for our spaces.

We have a designated fund for AV improvements with just over \$11,000. If this is a project that speaks to you, we would love to have you help us move forward with the upgrade project. We need an additional \$7,000 - \$9,000 to fully fund the work. Any funds raised beyond the needs of the project will go toward debt reduction. I really believe that one blessing for us as a parish from COVID has been the livestream. It gave us focus in the early days and now gives us dreams and ideas for all the additional things we can do in the future.

ST. FRANCIS XAVIER PARISH



Called to the Mission

Interesting, that as we celebrate just the third week of Ordinary Time, Scripture for this day is sounding much like the Lenten season: "The kingdom of God is at hand, repent, and believe in the Gospel."

It seems we ought to be hearing more about the little child Jesus, his growing up and maybe more of the experiences had by the Holy Family. But our Church has, in a way, fast-forwarded us to the beginning of Jesus' public ministry, as the Gospel of Mark tells of his identifying and calling forth the men we have come to know as his disciples, or Apostles. At times we interchange these two words; disciples and apostle, the distinction being that a disciple is "a follower or student of a teacher or leader," and so we are disciples as followers and learners of Jesus. Apostle refers to "one who is sent on a mission." Jesus first chose disciples, he then instructed them and "sent" them out as his apostles. We understand Apostles, capitalized, to be one of the twelve whom Jesus chose, taught, and then sent.

The men Jesus sent were for the most part fishermen by trade, so when Jesus said to them, "Come after me and I will make you fishers of men," they might have questioned, what does he mean to fish for men? Jesus of course, meant that he would teach them how to gather men (people) and help them to understand who Jesus was and how God was with them. Now, more than 2,020 years later do we understand what it means to "fish for men"? Do we understand our call as disciples to teach others and provide them knowledge of who Jesus is? That is the mission of the Catholic Church, to bring the Good News of Jesus Christ to the world and by our baptism we are called to participate in that mission. In responding to that call, we become apostles.

So, are we to leave our families, our way of life and travel about the world to preach the message of Jesus? Maybe not so literally, although some people are called and do become missionaries, dedicating the whole of their lives to the mission of preaching and teaching about Jesus. We can accomplish the same in many varied ways, often without leaving our homes, or jobs, or school. We can teach and preach about Jesus by our actions. As his disciples, we can live our lives in such a way that we convince others that it is the love of God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit, that guides us and forms us to become the people God intended we be. Christ-like people who love without judgement, show mercy to others, forgive, and pray as Jesus taught.

So, think about how you teach others by your example. Think about how you reflect, or not, the love of Jesus Christ for all people. And let us not forget that our actions often speak louder than our words. May God bless us all as we continue the mission of our beloved Church that began as Jesus chose those first fishers of men.
