

MINISTRY & LIFE PERSPECTIVES



The month of October brings up some mixed emotions for me. While I love seeing the beauty and majesty of God's creation in the Fall colors (especially this year), it also lets me know that the winter season will soon be upon us. For me that means hopping into the car in the morning

and being able to just start it up and drive off, will soon be replaced by the quick dash (be careful of the ice) out to the car to warm it up before I can leave for work.

But also October means (for me) the month of 2 Mary's. The first is the Blessed Virgin Mary the mother of Jesus. The second is my own beloved Grandmother (my mom's mother) who lost her battle with cancer in October of 1981. In my heart the two are intrinsically linked.

My Grandmother held a deep and passionate devotion to the Blessed Virgin. I could probably count on one hand the number of times that I would see her **without** her Rosary in hand throughout my life. PASTORAL MINISTRY



RCIA = Evangelizing

You may have seen the notice for RCIA on our common bulletin pages the past few weeks. It is a reminder to all members of our combined parishes to take time to pray for those who do not know the Lord or the practice of the Catholic faith and invite others to become Catholic.

Many may be thinking, "Why me, don't we have people at the church who are responsible for that?" Inviting others to RCIA is larger than any one or two people on staff – it is the responsibility of every baptized person, for in our baptism we joined in the mission of the Catholic Church: to bring the Good News of Jesus Christ to the world.

For many it begins in our family as one generation passes the gift of faith onto another. As we grow in faith through religious education, attendance at Mass, reception of the sacraments and life experience, we become true disciples of Jesus Christ. Knowing who we are as Christians includes the responsibility of sharing our faith in Jesus Christ with others.

As you wonder about how to do that - I want you to know — you already are! You are helping others to know Jesus Christ when you love God, your family, your neighbor. Living a Christian life that reflects God's love to the world teaches others the faith that you live. Those who do not know Jesus Christ and his Church are often drawn to know more as they witness how you live and how you love others.

Having taught RCIA for many years, I have often heard the participants say that they saw something in a member of the Catholic Church that they wanted for themselves. They had a desire to know more about why Catholics are so connected to Jesus Christ. They witnessed in members of the Church a desirable life. You, as a baptized Catholic, become for others a model of Christ's love. You influence others to know Jesus by your words and your actions.

Each of us needs to open our minds and our hearts to the work of evangelizing – bringing others to Christ. We must pray for the opportunity to invite others to consider membership in the Catholic Church. That may be in a subtle way as you are in conversation with colleagues, neighbors, co-workers, or it might be an outright question to another, "Have you ever thought about becoming Catholic?" Be brave and bold in proclaiming your Christian life and be gentle and inviting as you reach out to others.

Together, we can build the Kingdom of God right here in our One in Christ Area Catholic Community. Pray about this and ask God to present the right time and place for the conversation that may result in another coming to know his Son, Jesus Christ.

What is R.C.I.A.?

The $\underline{\mathbf{R}}$ ite of $\underline{\mathbf{C}}$ hristian $\underline{\mathbf{I}}$ nitiation of $\underline{\mathbf{A}}$ dults is the formal process of bringing adults into full membership in the Catholic Church.

Who is R.C.I.A. for? For adults who have not been baptized or were baptized in another Christian tradition and desire to explore becoming Catholic. In addition, there is a process for families and children.

RCIA is a Parish Initiative - All baptized members are called to evangelize; to invite others to come to know Jesus Christ. The parish community participates by modeling Christian living and praying for participants throughout the process.

Have you ever invited anyone to explore RCIA or to consider membership in the Catholic Church? Do you know of someone who might be interested? Or is it you?

What is involved? Weekly sessions of presentation, study and discussion of Church teaching, structure, Tradition, and sacramental preparation. This most often takes place Fall to Spring culminating in the celebration of the Easter Vigil.

How does one get started? You may call or meet in person with anyone of our Pastors, Deacons, Pastoral Associate or a parish contact listed below.

Our One in Christ Area Catholic Community is working together, sharing resources and instructors to serve those interested in knowing more about the Catholic Church.

For the next few weeks, names of interested persons will be gathered. Then a "Meeting of Inquiry" will provide time to gather (in-person or virtually) to pray, answer questions and provide information on how to begin RCIA.
