

#### MINISTRY & LIFE PERSPECTIVES



**Blessed Advent!** 

As we observe this season of hope, the Church has always invited us to stillness, reflection, calm, and confident waiting. This year, COVID imposes stillness that can be boredom or isolation from familiar routines and friends. Time for reflection can be lost to adapting our Christmas preparations and scrambling to keep up

with distance learning, working from home, or wrestling with technology. Our calm is disrupted by the troubles we face. Our waiting can be impatient, wanting things to get back to normal.

The demands of changed routines and the uncertainties are themselves burdens that weigh on our spirits, and we can feel discouragement or anxieties that make everything seem harder. But Christ, faithful to His promise, is with us always. The love of the One Who conquered death by the Cross does not yield to a virus.

Be kind to yourself and to those around you. We are all living through this challenge together, and that very fact can encourage us. Observing the health precautions inconvenient or bothersome as they may be at times - is itself a work of mercy and a quiet witness to others that you care. We cannot fully know the struggles or concerns of another; but things like a kind word, a smile, a listening ear never go astray.

Be thankful and find the positive. Of course there are many problems, but there are also blessings. Keep a list of how you have seen God at work, at least one item a day during Advent, and use that as part of your hopeful Advent preparation.

Take time to pray, individually and as a family. The Advent wreath can become an even more powerful symbol this year – the round shape a sign of the eternal love of God; the greenery reminding us of the ever-new life Jesus brings; the candles and their growing light preparing us for the Light of the World, revealed in a newborn Child, almighty and yet dependent on the care and love of Mary and Joseph.

Reach out to others. So many feel alone and isolated due to health concerns, and they can be greatly encouraged with a call or a card, a text or an email. Let your good intentions bear fruit and blossom like the poinsettias around you.

Spend some time with the familiar Advent and Christmas hymns that you can sing at home, or even simply read the lyrics (all the verses!) more prayerfully. O Come, O Come Emmanuel contains vast riches from the Old Testament, outlining the identity of the One we await. Find those titles of the Messiah and make them a focus for your prayer.

While we are not able to observe many of our traditions in the familiar ways this year, we can use that as an opportunity to discover their deeper meaning and value. Advent is about preparing ourselves to meet the revelation of God's mercy. How does the Lord want to make His love known to you when our hearts long even more deeply for peace, healing, wholeness, and the presence of those dear to us?

Creator of the stars of night, your people's everlasting light: O Christ, Redeemer of us all, We pray You, hear us when we call.





#### At Peace

In today's Second Reading from the Second Letter of St. Peter he speaks to us of the coming of the Lord. His letter was written after Jesus had risen, so he

is speaking of the Second Coming of Jesus. He informs us that for the Lord, one day is like a thousand years and a thousand years is like one day. In other words, God does not see time the same way as we have come to know time. That is why when Jesus said he would return soon, the disciples expected in a week, or a month, or perhaps a year. And still, we wait. And at the coming of Jesus Christ, the world we know will no longer exist but there will be a new heaven and a new earth in which righteousness dwells. In anticipation of this he writes:

"Therefore, beloved, since you await these things, be eager to be found without spot or blemish before him, at peace."

2 Peter 3.14

We are to prepare for the time by striving to live a good life, loving God, and his people and, to be at peace. We are not to be fearful or in torment, rather we ought to be waiting expectantly, knowing by our faith in Jesus that all will be well when he comes. In knowing that, believing that, and living as Christians, we can be at peace.

As we light the second candle on the Advent wreath, our focus is PEACE. We perhaps most often think of peace as "peace on earth" but it is important that we strive to be at peace within. God desires we live in peace, not with anxiety and angst in our lives, but calm, loving, and peaceful within. For when we are at peace, we are a better version of ourselves and that allows us to serve others with joy and compassion.

Are you at peace? Or do you long to be? What obstacles do you find in life that limit your ability to be at peace? How might you address those? Let us take time this week to examine our lives and how we do or do not experience peace and let us pray, asking God to guide us with his grace that peace might be ours. That we might as a people of God await the coming of Jesus with peace in our hearts.
