



Happy Gaudete Sunday!! Today we light the third candle in our Advent wreath. The pink candle that reminds us we are to be joyful. We are turning our eyes from preparing for the coming of the Lord to celebrating the birth of the Christ child.

So, how is your joy? Are you rejoicing in the coming of Christ into the world? Or are you struggling with all that 2020 has thrown at us and continues to do so? 

"Rejoice in the Lord always, again I say REJOICE!"

Today is known as "Gaudete" Sunday, a Latin word meaning REJOICE, which is the first word of the Collect or Opening Prayer read

by the priest on this day. This prayer is meant to gather (or collect) the prayers of all who are participating in the Mass and lift them to the Lord. It also sets a theme for each Mass.

On this Third Sunday of Advent we light the rose-colored candle on the Advent wreath and our theme is JOY. Joy in the realization that the Lord is coming soon. We are filled with anticipation and we feel within us a swelling of elation as we await the coming of Jesus.

We can hear the excitement in our Second Reading from St. Paul to the Thessalonians 5.16-24. I invite you to read this passage and to do so in a spirit of rejoicing. We are being encouraged to commit ourselves to a life of prayer that we might become holy in spirit, soul, and body. All of this helps us to be prepared to receive the Lord with joy in our hearts.

What brings you joy in life? Does knowing Jesus bring you joy? If so, you are called to share that joy with others. When we speak of our love for the Church and all of her Traditions, we ought to do that in a spirit of joy, that others might be attracted and might through our joy come to know Jesus Christ. It was Pope Francis who said we must be disciples of joy, we must not walk about like a sour pus, rather, share the joy of life we receive through Jesus.

Take time this week to think about what brings you joy and how you do or do not share it with others. Ask God to make known to you joy in living as his disciple. In a time that often feels void of joy, we need to reclaim the joy given by our creative and loving God. Let us be a people of joy. REJOICE!
